AN APPLICATION was made by Mr Robert Owen the First Claimant in person on behalf of the Claimants without the Defendant being in attendance or represented

AND THE JUDGE having read the written evidence filed and the Order of Mr Justice

Jack dated the 29<sup>th</sup> day of October 2009 where it was ordered that:

- "1) For his Contempt the Defendant Ian Taylor-Forrest stand committed to H.M. Prison Brixton for a period of 6 (six) weeks from the date of his apprehension.
- 2) The warrant of committal remain in the court office at the Royal Courts of Justice and that execution of it be suspended so long as the Defendant Ian Taylor-Forrest do by 30<sup>th</sup> November 2009 comply with paragraphs 2 and 3 of the Injunctions of The Honorable Mr Justice Burton and The Honorable Mr Justice Maddison dated 4<sup>th</sup> June 2009 and 10<sup>th</sup> September 2009 respectively and that after 30<sup>th</sup> November 2009 the sentence and warrant of committal be considered discharged in the event of compliance by that date.
- 3) Service on the Defendant of any documentation in this case may be effected by placing the documents in question in the appropriately addressed envelope through the letter-box of the Defendant's home address namely 4 Cherita Close, Dorset BH15 3SW
- 4) A transcript of today's judgment be provided at public expense and a copy be placed on the court file and further copies be provided to the Claimants, the Defendant and the Official Solicitor.
- 5) The contemnor has permission to apply to the Court to clear his contempt and ask for his discharge."

**IT IS ORDERED** that this application to issue the warrant of arrest be granted
